We trust that you have all had a pleasant half term break—it was lovely to see all of the children back on Tuesday.

As you know, we are continuing to keep the school well ventilated as one of our measures to prevent the spread of Covid. If your child is feeling the cold we request that they add layers underneath their uniform to enable them to still look smart in their school clothes. We would like to remind you that make up, painted/acrylic nails and large hair accessories are not part of school uniform and should not be worn.

We are also requesting that if you have a positive case in your household, please keep your child/ren at home until they have a negative PCR test. Please take a moment to re-read the information which was sent via Ping at the end of half term as this outlines our current extra precautions.

As a reminder: if your child is off school having tested positive for Covid-19, if they feel well enough to do work, they can log into Seesaw where there is a range of work set. We have used the national resource 'Oak Academy' which provides both teaching and activities to enhance your child's learning. All lessons are created to be completed as home learning.

Is your child often late to school or regularly being picked up early?

Whilst we appreciate that in the current situation there are strict rules about when your child is well enough to be able to come to school, we are finding that there are a number of children who are missing vital learning through being late to school or often being picked up early.

This chart gives an indication of the amount of time a child misses as it builds up over the year.

Every Minute Counts!

9:00am Your child has probably arrived just after most children as the so							most children as the school	
9:01am		Your child is late and has missed the beginning of the school day. Being a few minutes late often unsettles children.						
9:05a			m 5 minutes late a day means 3 lost days in a year.					
9:10a				Dam 10 minutes late a day means 6 lost days in a year.

Arriving after the register closes is recorded as an unauthorised absence
