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Some important reminders:

If your child is unwell and needs to take a PCR test please do let us know the result as soon as possible after you receive it - even if it is negative.

If your child is off with Covid (waiting for a test result of isolating due to having Covid) there is work set on Seesaw for Y1-6 to access. They only need to do it if they are feeling well enough.

Please remember to let the school know if your child has any allergies. It is important we are aware of this so that we can keep all children safe. We are a nut-free school as there are children with nut allergies.

All children with earrings need to either be able to take them out or cover in tape for PE. This is to ensure their safety when playing the games in the lessons. PE kits are to be left in school so that they are here when the children need them.
