Outcomes</li> <li>Improve attainment outcomes at end of KS1 and KS2</li> <li>Writing attainment needs to be improved particularly for more able.</li> </ul>	Pupil progress meetings will continue to be implemented on a half termly basis; teachers meet senior leaders to discuss all individuals and group progress in reading, writing and maths. Strategies for support or suitable interventions are identified from this meeting.  Raise accountability of sharing information with parents about current attainment through giving out report cards during autumn and spring term	Please make sure that you attend parent consultations in the autumn and spring term to hear about your child's progress.  We will make you aware if we are concerned about an aspect of your child's learning. Please ensure that you let us know if you are concerned so that we can work together on this aspect of learning.	Closer monitoring of individuals and ensuring that a child's attainment is made explicit to families will help us all to ensure that every child who is able is kept on track to meet end of key stage expectations.

Improve consistency in high quality teaching</li> <li>Ensure that all time in lessons is used productively</li> <li>Current attainment across the school in relation to age related expectations in variable – work is not well matched to the needs and teaching does not consistently challenge pupils</li> </ul>	parent consultations.  The Government releases assessment criteria for end of key stage expectations. We are now working to ensure that there are clear assessment criteria in place for each year group for both met expected standard and greater depth. These will be available on our school website from September.  Teachers will be using these criteria as part of their ongoing standardisation.  We are building links with other schools who have been recognised for their high quality, consistent delivery in teaching to ensure that our teachers have the opportunity to work with practitioners in some of the top UK schools (Teaching Schools) over the coming year.  Reflective Friday will be used across the school to increase pupil engagement in their own learning and review of targets.	Please ensure that you take the time to get to know the expectations for your child's year group for reading, writing and maths.	A more consistent approach will 'iron out' any inconsistencies in strength of teaching. Hence, pupils will make more consistent progress throughout the school.

This includes pupils self-selecting a level of challenge and additional extension activities always being available.  Staff training will be provided. We will be hosting a family workshop on challenge in the curriculum in the next academic year. Ensure that your child comes to school regularly and arrives on time, unless they are poorly or there are exceptional circumstances in which you have applied for leave.  As a school, we ask that you would be understanding of the fact that each pupil has very different needs and therefore we sometimes have to use different strategies with behaviour to support different pupils. Complete a review of maths provision and provide appropriate professional development for teachers to deliver high quality investigation and problem solving contexts for maths.	Encourage pupils to 'sound out' using their phonics.  Engage with opportunities to come and look at your child's work (we will be starting to hold open classroom sessions next year).
