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Year 5 Lunar Rocks:

This week, year five had an out of world experience. Thanks to a loan from NASA they had the opportunity to view and handle a selection of rocks from the moon and space.

Between 1969 and 1972, six manned Apollo missions successfully landed on the Moon, allowing the astronauts to collect samples

and bring them back to Earth. Some of these samples have been preserved in acrylic disks and along with a range of meteorites, tektites and fossils, year five have had the privilege of handling and working with them using magnetic probes,

magnifying glasses and flow charts to help classify the rocks.



Year 4 Quidditch:

As part of this term's work on Harry Potter, the children in Y4 have spent the week learning all about the game of quidditch.

They have written detailed information leaflets about the game and then had the chance to play it themselves. It was a fun and energetic afternoon requiring a great amount of team work.
