Sports News:

Last week some Year 6's took part in a Football tournament. We had two teams taking part and both teams had an impressive tournament!

The Red Team excelled in the group stages with three wins and a draw. They reached the semi-finals, where they drew 1-1 (thanks to a goal from Louie) but narrowly lost in a penalty shootout.

They redeemed themselves in the 3rd and 4th place playoff, securing a dominant victory to claim 3rd place overall.

The White Team performed well in the group stages and earned a spot in the 7th and 8th place playoff. They played with determination and scored the only goal of the match to secure 7th place out of 10. Well done to both teams for their fantastic effort and teamwork!

Some children from Year 6 have been selected for an exciting opportunity to develop their leadership skills through a Locality Leaders program at The Angmering School!

Their first session with Mr Jenner introduced them to the essential skills to become a sports leader. Based on students' feedback, the session was both engaging and enjoyable, setting the stage for future sessions filled with growth and learning.



This week saw the Year 6 Girls only Football tournament. The girls should be incredibly proud of their performance, especially with such a fantastic result as runners up. It's always inspiring to see players grow and develop their skills, particu-

larly those newer to the game. Their willingness to step up, even in challenging roles like goalkeeping, shows great teamwork and determination. What a great experience for everyone involved - congratulations to the team and those who supported them!





Snapshot of the week:

Year one have been learning how to attach paper or fabric together. They have been making their own choices about which materials they will use and have begun to explain their choice.

As part of our computing unit in Y6 we are creating interactive toys. The children thought about inputs and outputs of the BBC Micro:bit before planning their own toy. Then the children used the make code edition app on their iPads to create the code needed for their designs.







The children in Y4 have been coding their own games and debugging. This week they added a second level to show progression.



Year 6 thought about the different components of a song, and what makes it memorable. They then chose an existing Christmas song, and a had a go at changing the lyrics and melody using GarageBand.

- Strive to let parents know at a number of key points of the year how their child is doing. For example: parent's evening (which include progress cards), open classrooms each term and school reports at the end of the year.
- A great deal of work has been undertaken by the staff to ensure that planning for all subjects is thorough and robust with challenging outcomes offering the best opportunities for each child to succeed.
- Our children have a wide range of opportunities within school to enhance learning as well as embrace aspirations. This includes music, art, dance, sport and STEAM.
- We celebrate success in a range of ways: postcards or phone calls home, recognition, stickers, star awards, feedback, positive praise.
- We have an open door policy. Teachers and teaching assistants are at the door to welcome the children each morning as well as speak with parents. The leadership team are also on the gate each morning and afternoon.
- If there are barriers to learning, we have an experienced pastoral team who are able to offer a range of support to the children and also signpost parents to further support.
