

The Romans Rock! Year 3 Spring Term 2022

Rationale for Learning

This term we will be learning how archaeologists learn about the past by finding evidence and building up a picture through the artefacts that they find.

Suggested activities for families to help support learning

Keep practising the times tables, learn to tell the time, count out different amounts of money, add them together and work out the change given.

Join in with the homework task and assist your child to find out the information about different Roman words and their origins.

Encourage your child to read as often as possible and to take the accelerated reader quizzes as often as possible.

Key Vocabulary:

Children should be familiar with the Year 3-4 spelling lists and encouraged to learn to spell and use as many as possible.

Reminders

PE will be on Tuesday and Wednesday. Tuesday will be outside as much as possible so please ensure your child has warm outdoor clothing and appropriate footwear. Wednesday is a dance module which will take place indoors.



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Mathematics

Focusing on the children's knowledge of times tables facts and their inverse (division) facts.

Relationships of numbers facts eg if I know 3+4=7, Then I know 30+40=70

Weights and measures

Shape and symmetry

And of course a look at Roman numerals!

English

A focus on the book Escape from Pompeii by Christina Balit will be the main focus to inspire us to write stories with roman characters in different settings.

A study of volcanoes in the second half term will be the inspiration for some poetry writing, performing and presenting.

PSHCE

How I have changed and will change. What differences are there from myself as a newborn baby, a toddler, now and as an adult.

<u>Art</u>

Roman vases, Roman numerals, Laurel wreaths and mosaics, with clay pots, soldiers, shields, catapults and all things roman will take us through most of the art lessons. A focus on the work of the artist Margaret Godfrey will be the inspiration for our work on volcanoes.

Computing

Old school ICT with the children learning how to use Microsoft Word and Powerpoint to create presentations of facts that they have learned about the Romans. Including searching for facts and safe use of the internet.



History

We will be looking at the birth of Rome through its empire days focussing on Invasion, the army, Hadrian's Wall and Queen Boudicca.

We will be finding out what archaeologists do, studying mosaics, Roman roads, Roman music and finding out about Roman Gods.

RE

This term's RE focus is based on The Easter Story and the events leading up to the crucifixion and the different traditions that surround these dates.

Science

Studying Rocks and Soils.

What are they? How are they formed? Where are they found? How hard/soft are they?

Volcanoes.

Volcanic eruptions, how and why they occur. Creating mini volcanic experiments carrying out fair test. Learning the skills of carrying out an experiment.

Simple roman musical instruments and how they were played.
