Raise money for school without costing you a penny!

There is some parking available in Sanctuary Housing car park behind the school, however parents must adhere to the rules which are clearly displayed. Any breach of these rules, including overcrowding in the car park, disrespectful behaviour to the residents or their property (including littering), using outside the specified times could result in this being revoked and parking issues being even more complicated.
