

### **The Angmering Mile:**



As you may have seen on our Facebook page recently, we are excited to have been awarded Music Mark status. This is an exciting award which we were nominated for by The West Sussex Music hub, in recognition of the value Georgian Gardens places on music.



Music Mark recognises; “the hard work you and your colleagues do to ensure that pupils at your school are able to access and engage with a high-quality music education. Your dedication to offering and delivering a broad and balanced curriculum is both welcomed and celebrated.

Music Mark’s Vision is to achieve “Excellent musical learning in and out of school, for all children and young people in the UK, which inspires and enriches their lives”.

This is something we strive to achieve at Georgian Gardens, and we currently have over a quarter of our school receiving instrumental lessons. Lessons are currently available in guitar, keyboard, piano, voice and cello, while children in class have had the opportunity to learn how to play the glockenspiels and djembe drums in their class music lessons.

Our pupils are fortunate to receive both termly music mornings/ afternoons with a specialist music, as well as music in class with their own teachers.

We are very proud of our remodelled, dedicated Studio, which has become a real haven for many of our pupils, and it is exciting to see their creativity flourish.
