Key Stage 1 Angmering Mile:

Thursday saw our Year 5/6 team compete in a handball tournament alongside three other schools. We got off to a flying start with a 5 - 2 win against St Wilfrid's. The children played brilliantly as a team, showing thoughtful, strategic play that was a pleasure to watch. Next up was St John's, and again, the children stepped up, It took a little while to break the deadlock, and

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.		
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
