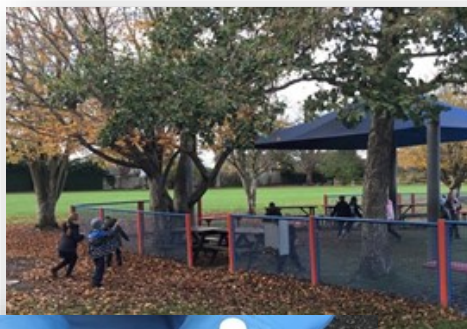

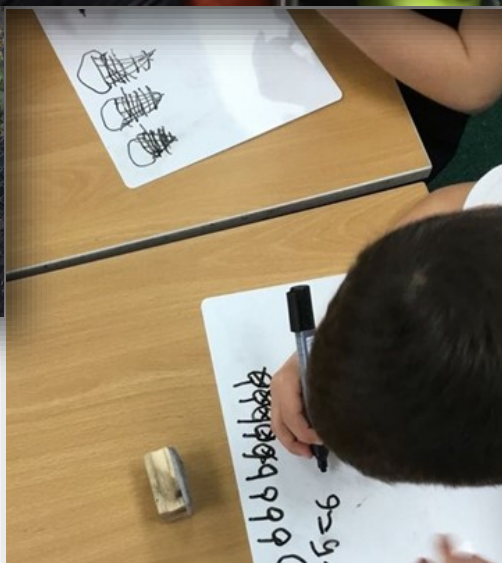
Sonny G 4TF - he gets to choose a book from Miss Bowers' selection of prize books.

Year 1 went on an autumn walk and observed the changes in the weather, temperature and the trees. We discussed how we saw snow today even though it's autumn.
