#### Y4 Trip to Butser Farm:

Butser Ancient Farm provided an immersive and interactive learning environment where the Year 4 children delved into the fascinating world of the Stone Age. We looked at the different types of settlements that existed during this period.

They completed a pottery workshop, where the children had the opportunity to create their very own clay pots. Another exciting activity was the archaeology session, where the children became archaeologist. Equipped with trowels, they uncovered ancient artefacts. The children also had the chance to participate in clunching, a traditional building technique used during the Stone Age. They worked together to construct walls using a mixture of chalk, dirt, and straw. The children had the unique opportunity to step inside reconstructed dwellings and observe first-hand the living conditions of the Stone Age inhabitants. They gained a comprehensive understanding of the diverse settlements and how they evolved over time.
