

We know that sometimes it can be easy to miss a 'School Ping' message as it requires the app to be opened to see if there is a new one. It is also possible to receive an email with information about the message in.

All you need to do is open the app (or website if using a PC/laptop), click on 'settings' then choose 'notifications'. You then have the option (as you can see on the example in the photo) to select to receive notifications of a message via email.


