

Once Upon a Time Roll up, roll up! Year One Spring Term 2025

Rationale for Learning

In the first half of our Spring term, we will continue our 'Once upon a time' topic. As we focused on geography last half term, the children will now explore history.

This will include learning about different sorts of homes; we will look at old and new houses in our local area. We will be learning about the Victorians and comparing modern and historical home life; using a wide range of resources including photos, videos and artefacts. Our trip, to the Weald & Downland Museum, will enable us to look more closely at homes from the past.

After half term, our topic will be 'Roll up, roll up!' We will be taking the children on an exciting learning journey around the world with our travelling circus. We will explore the different places the circus visits; we will locate continents and oceans. They will learn about different circus performers, their skills and the way that they use their bodies to perform. The children will find out the importance of staying healthy and taking care of their bodies.

Suggested activities for families to help support learning

- Please read with your child frequently as this will increase their vocabulary and phonic knowledge. The phonics sounds are in the reading record books to practice them as well.
- Practice reading and writing numbers up to 20 and beyond, as well as counting items.
- Practice counting forwards and backwards to 100 and beyond.
- When you are out and about, teach your child to recognise numbers on things like license plates, doors, road signs, and more.
- Discuss how to read an analogue clock, paying particular attention to the hours and half-past.

Key Vocabulary:

Topic – house, home, Victorian, chronology, history, past, present, future, character, plot, setting, continent, ocean, circus, performer,

Maths – count, forwards, backwards, more, less, equal, how many, greater, fewer, addition, subtraction, tens, ones.

Measure - heavy, heavier, heaviest, light, lighter, lightest, tall, taller, tallest, short, shorter, shortest, measure.

Shape – 2D, 3D, cube, cuboid, cylinder, sphere, pyramid

English – letter, sound, phoneme, digraph, trigraph, sentence, full stop, capital letter, finger space, conjunction (joining words).
