



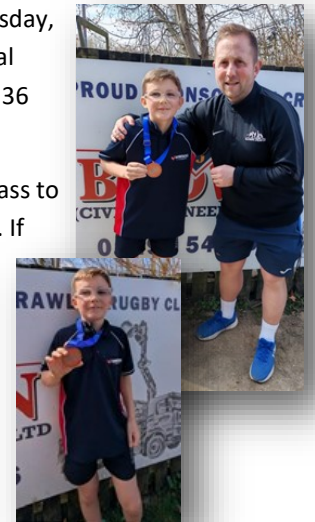

The draw will be during the week.

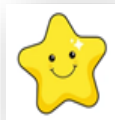

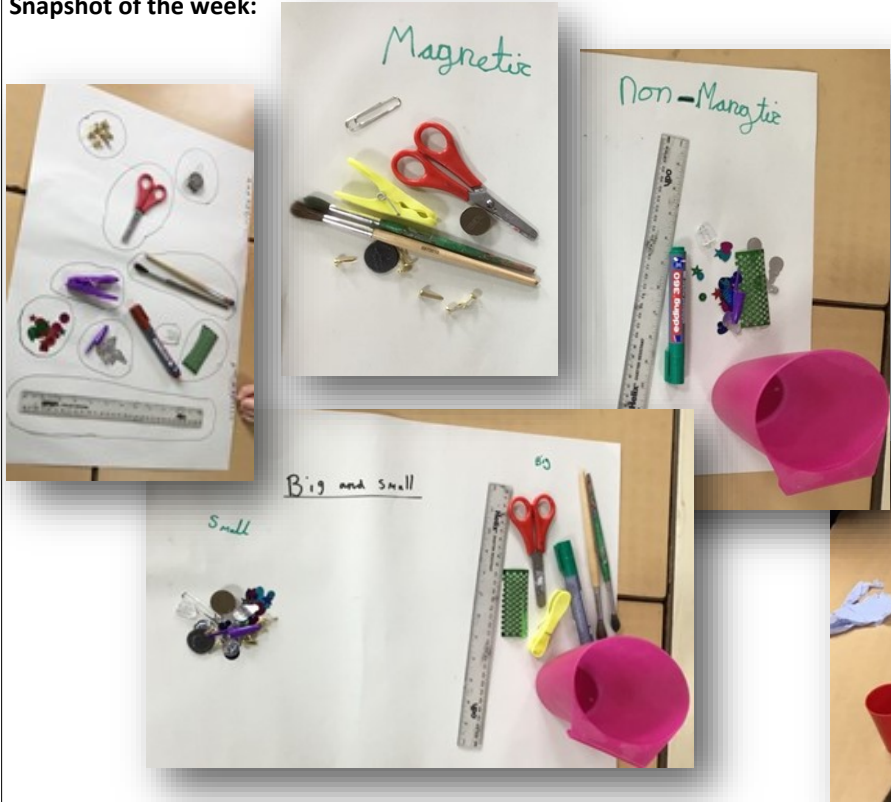

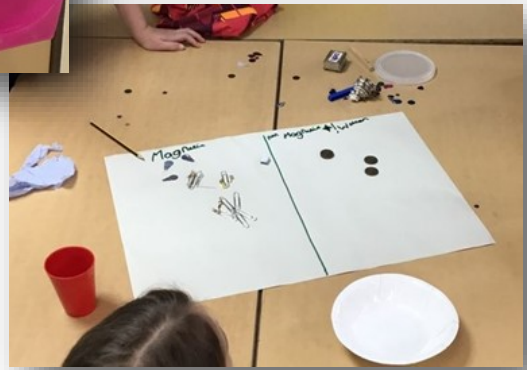

Snapshot of the week:



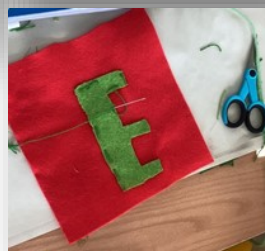
