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Playground Markings:

Thank you to every one of you! Without your generosity at any of our fundraising events, the amazing new playground markings would not have been possible. Such a huge project does not come cheap and so we are extremely grateful to the fundraising efforts of the PTA to enable this to happen.

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Important Reminders:

Epsom Gardens parking: it is crucial that you only park In designated parking spaces and not in front of resident's parking, gates or garages. Please be considerate when choosing where to park.

Littering: Please take any litter home with you. Our neighbours have reported seeing litter being thrown out of car windows in the car park area of school.

Uniform: Please remember that leggings are not part of school uniform unless worn under skirts in cold weather. We have a few children wearing them as trousers and this is not part of our uniform policy. STEAM Focus:

Exciting news! Easter STEAM competition

As part of the on-going work we are doing at school, we are excited about our ambition to transform into a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) specialist school. While this transformation is just beginning, we are already laying the groundwork for an enriching and innovative learning experience for our pupils.

One of our key focuses is the development of our outdoor learning spaces. We hope this will provide an engaging space for exploration and experimentation, fostering creativity and critical thinking skills in our pupils. In the coming weeks, we will be sending out more details about opportunities for local companies to get involved with sponsorship of this exciting development. Through enhancements to our outdoor areas, we aim to provide more opportunities for hands-on learning experiences that integrate our STEAM principles.

Additionally, we are currently in the process of reviewing our current curriculum to ensure that it aligns with our vision for STEAM education. By incorporating interdisciplinary approaches and real-world applications into our teaching, we aim to continue to inspire curiosity and a passion for learning in our students.

As part of our new focus on STEAM, we are keen to involve our families in exciting projects and activities. To kick things off, we are launching a family Egg Drop Challenge! In this competition, pupils and their families will work together to create a contraption capable of safely holding an egg and protecting it from a high drop. The contraptions will be tested multiple times, and prizes will be awarded for the most successful, well-designed, and well-constructed entries in each year group, as well as an overall winner.

Important Notice:

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Sports News:

Yesterday afternoon, saw the last of the league fixtures for both netball and football.
