ART FROM WASTE

Children in Georgian Gardens Community School Art Club are, this term, working on pieces of art to submit for Littlehampton Museum's Open Exhibition. Artists, both adults (amateur and professional) and children are invited to produce work will be exhibited from November 2023 to February 2024 in the museum's gallery area.

This year the theme (based on the public's choice) is PLASTIC.

As a starting point, the group discussed the issues of plastic waste and how it can adversely affect the environment; especially if the items are single use.

Wanting to upcycle plastic that would otherwise find its way into bins, the children were tasked with sourcing as wide a variety of textures and colours as possible. They set about collecting 'waste' plastic (sourcing fruit nets, wrappings from food items, flower wraps and broken plastic bags) and then discussing possible art projects that would be both creative and also highlight the issue of pollution and plastic waste.



The theme of the problem of plastic pollution in our seas and oceans was decided upon, with 3D scenes being the goal. The next stage was sorting and cutting up the plastics and fusing them into new, reuseable sheets of plastic by ironing the pieces between baking parchment. Wonderful new colour combinations and textures were created.

These pieces of material were then cut and shaped into waves and sea creatures and plants, with each child creating a scene based on the drawings they had produced during their research session.

The children's technology skills were employed with the choice of wire, wooden skewers, pipe cleaners, beads and buttons on offer to ' build' the scenes.

Each individual piece sends a powerful message (prompting us to reflect on our use of single use plastics) in addition to being a fascinating, beautiful, colourful creation.

Tax Free Childcare:

Tax-Free Childcare (TFC) is a childcare top-up for working parents. It can be used to help pay for accredited holiday clubs, childminders, or sports activities. This enables parents and carers to access childcare during the school holidays, also saving them money. It is estimated that there are 1.3 million working families who are eligible for TFC in the UK however only a small percentage are making use of the scheme. Around 75% of families are losing out on this support.

TFC is available for children aged up to 11, or 17 if the child has a disability. You can signpost families to Childcare Choices so they can see if they are eligible. You can find out more about the scheme by visiting <u>www.gov.uk/tax-free-childcare</u>.

Many parents don't realise that TFC can be saved up on their accounts. Even if childcare is not required throughout the school terms, there is still the option to save up funds which could be used for holiday clubs or out of school care. As the new term commences, it is a good opportunity to remind families of these schemes so they can plan for the upcoming half terms and holidays.
