Sporting news:

Children from Year 5 and 6 took part in a rounders tournament on Monday after school. Captained by Zack, who also scored some brilliant rounders, the team demonstrated fantastic fielding skills, particularly between the bowler, backstop and 1st base. This combination took many opposition out of the game. The team won two of their games and lost one to who were the eventual winners.

Tuesday afternoon saw some children from KS1 compete in a Gifted and Talented event. The children took part in 4 Square (a throwing and catching game), sitting volleyball and Kurling. Winning every event during the afternoon, Georgian Gardens came away with the trophy!









Drop off and pick up times:

We are seeing an increasing amount of pupils arriving late for school, particularly in KS2. Although the gates are open until 9am this is for the KS1 who are due to start at 9am. KS2 lessons start at 8:50 and we are concerned that a number of pupils are missing the start of their day. If children are late on a regular basis this can really impact on their learning as they miss vital inputs to their lessons. Repeated late marks in the register can also count towards absence and trigger a fixed penalty notice.

Additionally, we have a small number of pupils who are not being collected promptly at the end of the school day. KS1 classes finish at 3:10 and KS2 finish at 3:15. Pupils should be collected at these times as we do not have capacity for parents being late as staff need to attend meetings etc. Of course we understand that on the odd occasion people may get caught up and we have the provision for pupils to wait in the office area. However, this should only be for one off situations whereby you inform the office of the issue at the end of the day before scheduled pick up time. If you are unable to collect daily at these times, you may wish to consider paying for a place at The Hive afterschool care who offer flexible after school care arrangements.

Although we have food donations from supermarkets and other suppliers, it is becoming harder for suppliers to spread food donations around the local community. If you are able to donate essential food items for families at school who are struggling, please bring them to the food donation point outside the school reception. The items of food that we could do with on a regular basis are: cereals, UHT semi-skimmed milk, pasta, rice, pasta sauce, tuna, tinned pies, tinned tomatoes, tinned fruit, tea bags, coffee, squash and baked beans.
