By the time each child leaves Georgian Gardens they will have had the opportunity to learn a musical instrument in Years 2,3,4 and 5.

In Year R children follow Charanga units, as well as lesson planned by the class teacher. Over the course of the year children also learn syllables, fitting with their daily phonics song. Children explore a range of instruments and listen to different types of music, discussing their emotions. Children have 3 sessions with a specialist music teacher.
