### Parent Survey Feedback:

Each week we will be giving a response in the newsletter to one of the questions which was asked in the parent survey before the summer holiday.

'My child has SEND and they give them the support they need.'

You said...

82% of you said that your child does not have SEND with just 2% disagreeing with the statement. This equates to one child.

We will always...

- We conduct regular assessments and gather information about the children and their progress in order to promptly identify any additional needs and tailor support accordingly. This is based on the needs of the child, whether a diagnosis is in place or not.
- We have recently been awarded the Autism Aware Award for the second time.
- We ensure that parents are kept informed about their child's progress and the support strategies being implemented. As a minimum, we offer parents/open evenings at least three times a year to discuss outcomes and set future goals. We have an open door policy should parents want to discuss their child outside of these times.
- We believe in the importance of working closely with parents. If you have concerns about your child's progress or wellbeing, please do not hesitate to reach out to your child's class teacher, our Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO) or a member of The Hub Team.
- We are taking part in the Partnership for Inclusion of Neurodiversity in Schools (PINS) programme this year which aims to improve the experience of mainstream school for children who may have an additional special educational need or disability. We would love to see you at our coffee morning with the West Sussex Parent Carer Forum on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November after drop off in the Family Room.

We appreciate your feedback and are committed to fostering an inclusive environment where every pupil can succeed.
