

Roll Up, Roll Up! Year One Summer Term 2024

Rationale for Learning

This term we will taking the children on an exciting learning journey around the world with our travelling circus. They will learn about different circus performers, their skills and the way that they use their bodies to perform. We will explore the different places the circus visits; using Digimaps we will locate continents and oceans, as well as places within our local community.

Engaging and exciting books will be a stimulus for the learning and cross-curricular links made.

Suggested activities for families to help support learning

Please continue to read daily with your child and practice the phonemes, in preparation for the phonics screening in June.

Counting past 100 forwards and backwards to and from any number; counting in 2s, 5s and 10s; telling the time (o' clock and half past); weighing and measuring.

Key Vocabulary:

Topic - circus, performer, skill, acrobat, juggler, clown, ringmaster, animal,

country, capital city, continent, ocean, world, season, physical, human

Maths - addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, equals, fraction, more, less

English – adjective, alliteration, rhyme, suffix, prefix, exclamation mark, question mark
