

Rail safety:

Network rail have contacted the school over concerns about young people playing on the tracks and the dangers of this. Here is a link to a short video on this issue which you may wish to share with your child (from ages 7-11). It would be advisable to watch the video yourself before sharing it so that you are able to discuss any of the themes. Living so close to a busy railway line is wonderful yet does present many potential dangers if misused.

From Network Rail:

The session is less than 15 minutes and explains why it is important to stay safe near the tracks. Over 14 million students, parents and teachers from across the UK have watched these videos which has led to a significant decrease in the number of trespasses in their area through watching the latest rail safety videos. Remember 15 mins can help save lives and provide important safety information to young people and their parents.
