#### **Important Reminders:**



On Friday Freya and Ruby from Year 5 joined St Margaret's Football team to play in a tournament in Worthing. The match report is from Freya and Ruby!



### Monday 18th March:

Please note the information in today's School Ping message regarding arrival at school on Monday. We are very excited to be having the new playground markings laid but it will does mean a slight change to arrangements for just one day. Main headlines...

...From 7am the two larger playgrounds will be closed, except for an access section for the huts. The infant playground will remain open throughout the day.
