
Luna Rock Special

Pupils had an out of world experience last week. Thanks to a loan from NASA they had the opportunity to view and handle a selection of rocks from the moon and space. Between 1969 and 1972, six manned Apollo missions successfully landed on the Moon, allowing the astronauts to collect samples and bring them back to Earth for study. Some of these samples have been preserved in acrylic disks and along with a range of meteorites, tektites and fossils, year five have had the privilege of handling and working with them.

T4 Science:


Year 4 were testing the effect different liquids had on their teeth. We found that water damaged the teeth (egg) the least, both by not staining and firmness, and the vinegar stained the teeth (egg) and the enamel (eggshell) the most. It became stained, soft and had expanded.
