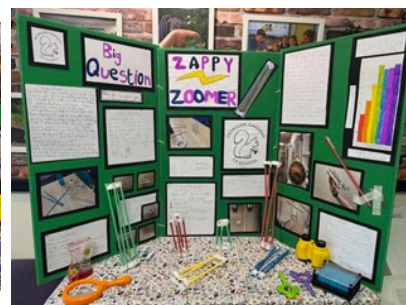

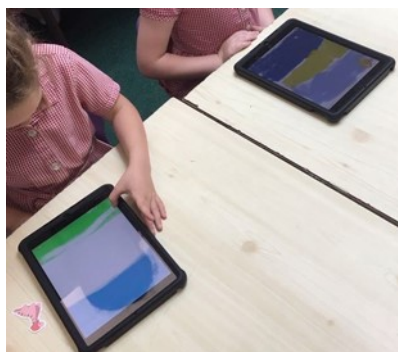
Snapshot of the week:



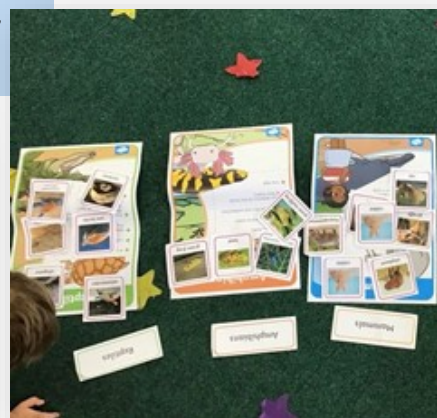
Y3 walked around the school field, looking for as many different seeds as we could find. We tried to identify them, and sketched pictures. We tried to work out which method was used for their dispersal.



Year One explored Brushes Redux in the IPADS, trying to make different pictures and learning how to save what they had drawn.



Year One learnt about different types of animals. We sorted them into 5 types: birds, fish, mammals, reptiles and amphibians. We then made books, with a page about each type of animal.



Y5 and Y6 Legacy Games:

On Wednesday, all children from Y5 and 6 went up to The Angmering School for the annual legacy games event. They spent the day competing against the other primary schools in our locality in a carousel of sporting activities. A good day was had by all.



Year 3 and 4 End Ball competition:

On Thursday afternoon, a group of enthusiastic Year 3 and 4 children took part in an end ball competition at the Angmering School. End ball is a relatively new game for the pupils but they quickly got to grips with the rules and showed fantastic enthusiasm and sportsmanship throughout. The event was a triangular competition between 3 schools ourselves: St Margaret's and East Preston Junior School. Our first match was against St Margaret's as it was our first real experience of the game. We had a slow start and despite improving as the game went on we narrowly lost. We then had a game off which gave us the perfect chance to reflect, practice on the side-line, and better understand positioning and this preparation paid off in our final match against East Preston, the team worked brilliantly together making space calling for the ball and involving every player their efforts led to a convincing win. With one win and one loss, we finished second - overall a fantastic achievement for such a new Team. Well done to all the children who took part.



Y3 Big Sing:

On Wednesday afternoon, all of the children in Y3 went to The Angmering School for the annual 'Big Sing' event. They had learnt the songs before hand and enjoyed getting together with pupils from St Margaret's Primary School, all led by Emily Barden from West Sussex music, to feel the joy of singing.





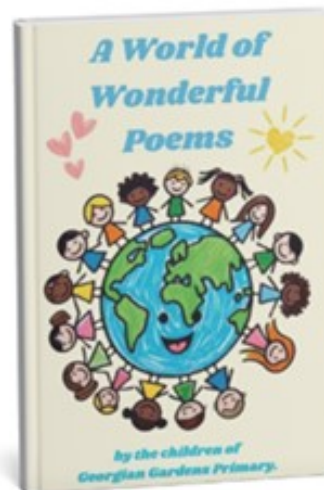
Tesco Tokens:

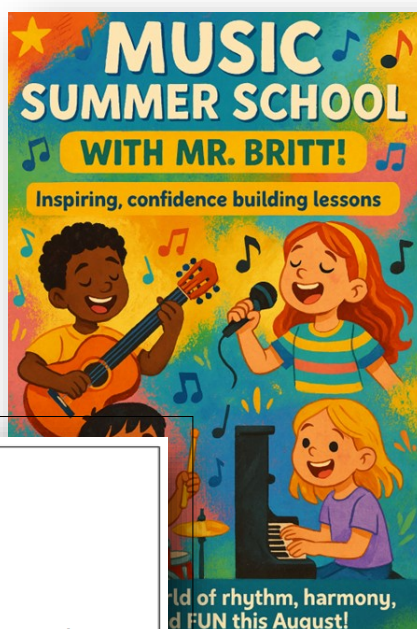


GG Poetry Book:
