It certainly has been a hot week! Goblin Cars:

On Sunday 10th July, a keen group of Y5 engineers went to Goodwood Motor Circuit to race the school 'goblin electric car'. Across the day, they had to take part in a series of different events including a drag race, slalom, chicane and a race to change the four wheels on the car (the 'pit stop challenge').

The children did amazingly in these events and we had lots of clear runs meaning that we missed all the cones. The day culminated in the race of champions where all 64 cars line up on the start grid of Goodwood motor circuit. The 'pusher' and the 'driver' had to be on the grid waiting for the instructions and safety checks before the race began. Five cars started at a time followed by the next 5 just 10 seconds later. Team GG were in the 5th row of the start-up line with 20 cars in front. It can take 9 and a half minutes to complete the full 2.4 mile track Goodwood. We all waited to see the cars begin to return and could see Georgian Gardens car in the first 10. We then had an anxious wait until all the times had been collected in and the final positions had been worked out. We were excited to discover that we had placed 3rd. This was a huge achievement considering that 64 cars had started the race. Well done to the team and everyone who helped. The team was made up of Year 5s and they were:

St. Peter and St. Paul Pantry runs every Thursday (term-time only) outside the school huts where fresh fruit and vegetables are on offer and inside where we provide dried food, frozen food, hygiene products and children's clothing. We welcome anyone at the school who could do with a helping hand in topping up their food cupboard. Although we have food donations from supermarkets and other suppliers, it is becoming harder for suppliers to spread food donations around the local community. **If you are able to donate essential food items for families at school who are struggling, please bring them to the food donation point outside the school reception.** The items of food that we could do with on a regular basis are: cereals, UHT semi-skimmed milk, pasta, rice, pasta sauce, tuna, tinned pies, tinned tomatoes, tinned fruit, tea bags, coffee, squash and baked beans.
